Community Growing Resource Pack

Research into disabled learners' progression through college

Lead Scotland was recently commissioned to carry out research to find out why disabled college learners are not progressing through learning levels as well as non-disabled learners. They carried out 2 separate surveys with learners and parents, as well as some follow-up interviews, and found that:

- 40% of learners didn't move up to the next SCQF level when moving between learning levels
- the majority of learners (43%) didn't progress to the next level for reasons relating to their impairment
- the majority of learners (65%) who left college early did so for reasons relating to their impairment

£100m for mental health



The Scottish Government

An extra £85 million will be invested in improving mental health services over the next five years.

The money is on top of the existing £15 million fund for mental health innovation, announced last year, making a total additional investment of £100 million over the next five years.

The fund will partly be used to further improve child and adolescent mental health (CAMHS) services, and bring down waiting times. It will also be targeted at improving access to services, in particular psychological therapies, improve responses to mental health in primary care, promote wellbeing through physical activity, and improve patient rights.

Third sector service providers will be key to delivering new services, and there will be a focus on innovation and providing services in community settings.
