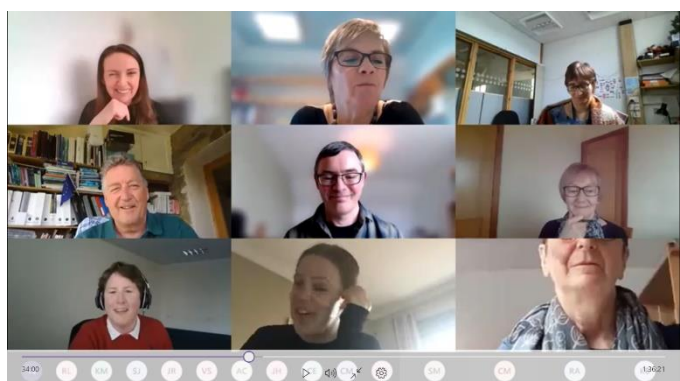

## Tech Peer Mentor Project Launch

The Tech Peer Mentor project launch was held on 6 May to raise awareness of both the project and the Transforming Local Systems Pathfinder programme that it is part of. The project has an aim of increasing the use of Technology Enabled Care (TEC) in Orkney and will work with organisations, service users and members of the public to encourage and support greater use of digital technology in health and care. Orkney is a named partner to East Ayrshire in the Pathfinder programme and we were lucky enough to have the East Ayrshire Pathfinder team attend the launch and also deliver a presentation on the Irvine Valley area, which is a focus for that team. The presentation was very well received by attendees and the similar themes and issues that have emerged in both the Irvine Valley and Orkney during recent public consultation were commented on. The aim is that by matching areas with similarities there will be greater scope to learn from each other in developing the work of both projects. The event also included presentations by Lynda Bradford, Head of Health and Community Care and by Pete McAndrew, Tech Peer Mentor and facilitated discussion afterwards. Although the workshop session had to be cut short due to time constraints, lots of interesting points were discussed



and views shared. Some comments afterwards were that “listening to what other areas were doing/have done - it gives fresh ideas and perspective” and “lots of enthusiasm in the room, which was great!”

It was great that the launch was so well attended by a wide range of representation including from elected members, Orkney Health and Care, NHS Orkney and the Third sector. The session was recorded and is available to watch by following this [link](#).

During the event Pete spoke about the ‘one button computer’ that he currently has on a trial basis that is called Komp. This is a computer that can receive messages, photos and can be used for video calling but doesn’t need the person using it to have any digital skills at all! The one button is used to turn it on and it controls the volume (just like the old TVs, which it’s designed to look similar to). It’s used to reduce social isolation and loneliness for people who have no digital skills by enabling them to benefit from being digitally connected. If you are working with someone who

you think could benefit from this and would be willing to take part in a trial please get in touch. Gaining feedback from people using the device would be hugely helpful in informing whether this is something that would be invested in over a longer period. ## SCVO - Adapt and Thrive Programme Extended

Tesco Community Grants will award funding to charities and community organisations for local projects that focus on supporting children and families. Projects that tackle food poverty are also invited to apply.

Funding pots of £500, up to £1000 and up to £1500 will be available for projects and Tesco customers will be able to choose which project receives the most funding by voting in store every time they shop. The scheme is open to registered charities and not-for-profit organisations, via an on-line application form. ## Scottish Government - Survey on Volunteering and the Third Sector Response to COVID-19

The Scottish Government's Volunteering Survey aims to gather information about:

- how volunteering has contributed to the Third Sector response to the pandemic;
- the challenges that the sector has faced in continuing to support volunteering during this time;
- and – crucially – organisational perspectives on what is needed to support volunteering during the recovery period and beyond.

The survey is split into two routes:

- one targeted at TSIs, Local Authorities and intermediary organisations;
- the other aimed at organisations working directly with volunteers (volunteer-involving organisations).
