It's Trustees' Week 2021!



Trustees' Week 2021 runs for the first week of November 1st - 5th and Voluntary Action Orkney will be offering online information, advice and holding a drop in event for trustees in Orkney.

Trustees look after the assets of a charity or a voluntary organisation including property, money and equipment and the board of trustees are responsible for making sure the

organisation aims, objectives and purposes are fulfilled.

It has been a challenging time for trustees and their organisations, normal activities have been cancelled or postponed, fundraising opportunities have been on hold and meetings and events have moved online. VAO hopes to help organisations as they start to recruit to their boards, providing support for existing trustees and helping organisations recruit and train new trustees.

Throughout Trustees' Week we will be providing advice, explaining what VAO can do to help ensure your Board has access to training and support and linking to some great resources.

We will also be at Kirkwall library on Monday 1 November between 1pm-4pm where you can drop by anytime for a chat about being a trustee or about more general volunteering in Orkney.

Communities Mental Health and Wellbeing Fund

VAO is delighted to confirm that as a part of the TSI Scotland Network, we are currently working towards the launch of this Scottish Government fund designed to support community based initiatives that promote and develop good mental health and wellbeing and mitigate and protect against the impact of distress and mental ill health within the adult population.

Details about eligibility criteria and how to apply to this grants programme will be published early in November. Applications will be assessed by the VAO team on a rolling basis to enable faster distribution of the funds.

Third Sector Emergency Covid-19 Funding – Applications Sought

Following two successful funding rounds of the Third Sector Covid Emergency Fund, we are announcing that the third round is now underway.

VAO is administering the fund on behalf of Orkney Islands Council, and eligible organisations can apply for up to £30,000 with an option to re-apply later in the current financial year depending on their circumstances at the time and the remaining funds available.

We would urge organisations both large and small that are facing significant resource challenges as a direct result of the pandemic to apply. Whilst the maximum that can be applied for is £30,000, we are aware that smaller grants have made a significant difference to our smaller local organisations.

Give your views on the public procurement system in Scotland

The Scottish Government has asked Blake Stevenson, a social research company, to gather feedback about recent experiences of the public procurement system in Scotland. The purpose of the research is to gain an understanding of the experiences of third sector organisations and new private businesses (defined as businesses set up fewer than five years ago) of public procurement in Scotland. The research will inform future development of public procurement processes, ensuring that it is as inclusive as possible.

Blake Stevenson will undertake this research in two ways – through interviews with third sector organisations and private businesses, and through a survey of third sector organisations and private businesses.

The Young Person's Guarantee Marketplace will be a chance for employers to learn about some of the support that is available locally to help them create opportunities in their business for young people. A range of providers and support agencies will be on hand to provide information and support and answer any questions employers may have.

Employers can learn about Apprenticeships, Employer Recruitment Incentive (ERI) funding, the Kickstart Scheme and other incentives available to employers who recruit young people. Employers can also find out how these organisations and providers support young people and help to prepare them for the world of work.

All of these initiatives and incentives support the delivery of the Young Person's Guarantee, which aims to give all young people, aged 16-24 years in Scotland, the chance to succeed through the opportunity of a job, apprenticeship, education, training or volunteering.
