#### **Orkney 2025 Inspire – Encourage – Involve**



Once every two years, thousands of athletes from across the globe — from Scandinavia to the Mediterranean, the North Atlantic to the Caribbean — come together to compete in the International Island Games.

Orkney will have the privilege of hosting the 20th International Island Games from 12 – 18 July 2025. This week-long event will see athletes from up to 25 island groups from across the world compete in 13 sports: Archery, Athletics, Badminton, Bowls, Cycling, Clay Shooting, Football, Golf, Gymnastics, Sailing, Squash, Swimming and Triathlon.

With over 2,500 Competitors and Officials expected to attend (as well as their travelling support) this is set to be the biggest event Orkney has ever hosted.

All Island communities participating understand the importance of promoting a healthy lifestyle, providing a focus for young people, and strengthening an island nation's cultural identity.

The Orkney 2025 Mission Statement highlights that this is more than just a sporting event and will have a significant impact on Physical Activity & Sport in Orkney as it aims to:

- · Provide a competitive sporting programme in excellent facilities
- Create a meaningful legacy for local sport and communities
- Involve communities and businesses as much as possible
- Celebrate the best of Orkney: place, produce and people
- Make the 2025 Games as environmentally friendly as possible

There will be many exciting opportunities to volunteer to support the games over the coming months and years. One of the first

#### Addressing child poverty through parental employment

The Social Justice and Social Security Committee has launched a call for views inviting people and organisations across Scotland to share their views on the support parents would benefit from while seeking employment.

As part of its inquiry into addressing child poverty through parental employment, the Committee is looking at how the Scottish Government is working with local authorities, employers and other partners and wants to understand how they are supporting parents find suitable jobs or move into better paid work.

The call for views follows the Committee having embarked on a series of visits to meet parents in different areas around Scotland. It builds upon the issues and ideas raised during those visits and asks people for their thoughts on what changes the Scottish Government could do that would have the most impact.

The Committee is keen to hear from people across Scotland and is particularly interested in the views and experience of:

- employers
- lone parents
- people from an ethnic minority background
- · families with a disabled adult or child
- young mothers (under 25)
- · parents to a child under the age of one
- families with three, or more, children
- · organisations who provide support
