Orkney Drugs Dog available for community group talks



The Orkney Drugs Dog is keen to hear from any community groups who would be interested in a talk from the charity's dog handler, Kevin Moar.

The charity, which operates with two fully trained search dogs (Zoe and Keegan, pictured), plays an important role in reducing the supply and trade of illegal drugs in Orkney.

Much of their work sees them searching the entry points to the county, such as the ferry ports, airport, and package depots.

However, Kevin and dogs also give talks to people of all ages about the work the charity does and to raise awareness of the dangers of such substances and why the trade can have hugely

detrimental effects on small communities such as those here in Orkney.

The charity is keen to hear from any groups who may wish to welcome Kevin along to a meeting. He would be happy to bring one of the dogs along to the session and talk about how they work.

Some of the topics covered would be:

- The work of the charity.
- Drugs awareness and the dangers of illegal substances.
- Impact to the individual, family and wider community.
- Drugs Box.
- Keegan and Zoe, how they are trained etc.
- · How to report suspected drug issues (use, dealing etc).



If practicable then a short demonstration could also be conducted. This will depend on location and its suitability to conduct it.

Clan Cancer Support: Wur Westray Connection

The Orkney BRCA1 Gene Story: Beyond Westray - A talk by Prof. Zosia Miedzybrodzka Wednesday 22 November The Orkney Arts Theatre 7pm for a 7.30pm start



In March news that a gene variant in the breast and ovarian cancer gene BRCA1 that arose in 1600s Westray is common in Orcadians hit the news from Pierowall to New Zealand. Westray Development Trust funded a pilot study to get a system for NHS self-administered saliva testing

up and running. CLAN has invited Prof Zosia Miedzybrodzka of the University of Aberdeen and service director of the NHS Grampian genetics service to tell us about the discovery of the variant, what it means for women and men with Westray ancestors and to discuss plans for how testing for the gene could be made available beyond Westray.

Communities Mental Health and Wellbeing Fund – Round 3

A grant fund aimed at supporting community-based initiatives that promote and develop good mental health and wellbeing within the adult population is open for applications.

The Communities Mental Health and Wellbeing Fund for adults has a total of £75,000 available for projects in Orkney, with the Fund being managed on behalf of the Scottish Government by Voluntary Action Orkney in partnership with the Orkney Partnership.

The projects supported will benefit communities right across Orkney, and can offer a wide range of activities, such as fitness and gentle sports, provide equipment and enable the set-up of self-help support groups, support those with long term and life limiting illness, offer access to learning and arts activities.

The successful applications will deliver against some or all of the local priorities for the Fund, which were developed by a panel which included local statutory and third sector organisations and people with lived experience of mental ill health.

The local priorities are:

- Poverty
- Social isolation
- Prevention of Suicide
- Unpaid Carers
- Older People

The deadline for applications is 5pm on Friday 12 January 2024.

Heath Issues in the Community - Two short courses

Scotland's first ever National Islands Plan was published in 2019. It is now being reviewed as required by the Islands (Scotland) Act 2018, which may lead to the publication of a new National Islands Plan. The Scottish Government has stated that it wants to work with local authorities, island communities and relevant sectors and partners to ensure this process is as thorough and effective as possible, providing them with vital feedback from those most impacted by the National Islands Plan.

The purpose of the National Islands Plan (the Plan), as set out by the Islands (Scotland) Act 2018 (the Act), is "to set out the main objectives and strategy of the Scottish Ministers in relation to improving outcomes for island communities that result from, or are contributed to by, the carrying out of functions of a public nature".
